MEETING SUMMARY

DECISIONS AND ACTION ITEMS

1. Introductions:

On June 15, 2010 BMAGIC held its thirty-third Community Convener Meeting at the Joseph Lee Recreation Center after a two months of hosting meetings at other local organization sites. The attendance was lower than usual at this meeting most likely due to the start of summer programming for many organizations. Marquez Gray, Community Convener, started the meeting with a brief update that we would be going over important upcoming events such as the Backpack Giveaway, talking about past endeavors within the collaborative like our professional development workshops, and having several presentations from the SEVA Project and Suicide Prevention.

The group then moved into an ice-breaker activity in which everyone was asked to state their name, organization, and to answer the question: How do you see your health affecting your relationships with others? The group shared their modes of staying fit and healthy, discussed their barriers to meeting health goals, and at what level they would like their health to be in the near future. Many also talked about how important being healthy is for the relationships with family and friends, especially their children.

2. COMMUNITY/ CAPACITY BUILDING

RECAP ON PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS- Julia Weisner, Research and Program Coordinator, gave the group an update on past professional development trainings offered to the collaborative through BMAGIC. Overall there were seven trainings offered in the past two months for service providers from groups like CalSAC, Edgewood, and Team Up for Youth. These trainings focused on topics such as program planning, cultural competency and behavioral health. Overall 40 people from the collaborative attended the different trainings. Moving forward, BMAGIC Staff has met to discuss what could be done differently in the fall for our next round of trainings. We had several important takeaways from this experience. First, we plan on having initial meetings with trainers to ensure that they have a better understanding of the collaborative, the needs of our members and that there are tangible takeaways for people to apply to their work. The trainings in the fall will be more focused on the areas of health equity, LGBTQ youth (offered through the BMAGIC working group), and working with youth on probation and foster youth. 3. PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

The biggest change for the year will be that BMAGIC is asking community and city sponsors to donate all of the school supplies for event rather than purchasing them without any investment from the collaborative. Julia reminded the group that this list of all the needed items and who has already promised what is posted on the BMAGIC Website. Marquez announced to the group that he has been contacting merchants in the area about selling low-cost food items at the event. These food options will include a local soul food restaurant and taqueria.

4. PRESENTATIONS

UCSF/SEVA Part II- Roberto Vargas from the UCSF/SEVA Project came to present the critical areas for health policy from SEVA for Bayview Hunters Point. These include: After violence (preventing future violence), Environment (clean and safe), Food access, Social Supports, Next Generation (engage and mentor youth), Healthcare access. He asked the collaborative for feedback on the results and explained that this would be an important tool for bringing in dollars to the community. He also invited the public to the upcoming meeting to consider changes to these recommendations. His contact information can be found in the sign-in sheet on the first page of these minutes.

SUICIDE PREVENTION- Keyshia Montgomery from Suicide Prevention presented to the group on the organization's work which involves healing arts for community, and resources on how to deal with trauma through story telling. She then shared with the group one of the narratives that she typically performs for her youth around looking for guidance from her ancestors when in need of strength.
