During the summer, we run intensive introductory and advanced courses that last 6 weeks, respectively. There are no GPA requirements and any student who attends a San Francisco public school is encouraged to apply. Given the lack of diversity in the tech industry and our focus on equity, we accept applications from students of color and female students who attend private schools in San Francisco as well. For Summer 2017 Courses: Mission Bit has a selective admissions process. Students that enroll in Mission Bit courses will earn a \$300 stipend.
