Level III Under supervision of the Program Coordinator, Recreation Supervisor or Park Service Area Manager, the Recreation Leader is responsible for the delivery of all Certified recreation, leisure and sport programs and activities in which the Recreation and Parks Department require the employee to be certified. May also be responsible for the set up and take down of tables and chairs and occasional janitorial tasks; and performs related duties as required. Distinguishing Feature: The Recreation Leader level I performs facility monitoring and may assist a more experienced Recreation Leader in program delivery, while level II and III are responsible for recreation, leisure and sport programs and activities. Level II is distinguished from level III in that the latter is responsible for delivery of all recreation programs and activities that require certification.
