NOTES: Spotlight on the Arts is a paid summer internship program that is sponsored by California Lawyers for the Arts. The program is open to rising sophomores, juniors and rising seniors ages 14-17. Youth are placed in internships at arts organizations in all the arts (theater, music, visual, media, literary, multi-disciplinary) based on their interests for 16 hours a week and attend weekly 4-hour enrichment workshops with interactive exercises in communication, conflict resolution, job readiness, career exploration, college preparedness, tours of arts facilities, and speakers on careers in the arts. The program runs from June 22 through August 10. 2018.

NOTES: In partnership with the California Preterm Birth Initiative (PTBi-CA) at UC San Francisco (UCSF), the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) has initiated a multi-year Collective Impact program to reduce racial disparities in preterm births among San Francisco residents. Prematurity is a leading cause of infant mortality and childhood disability. Addressing the social, economic, and environmental determinants of preterm birth requires the engagement of institutions across sectors in partnership with communities affected by preterm birth. Collective Impact (CI) is the commitment of a

group of actors from different sectors to a common agenda for solving a specific social problem, using a structured form of collaboration. This position will serve as the “Program Associate” (PA) who will support the Program Manager in leading this multi-sector initiative. This is a grant-funded, full time, temporary and benefitted position. Employee is provided by Heluna Health.

The Commission also appoints and regulates Patrol Special Officers and may suspend or dismiss Patrol Special Officers after a hearing on charges filed.
