PRESENTATIONS

1. MNC/Good Samaritan/El Centro Bayview – Christina Olague, Family Resource Center, Lead Family Support Specialist Jessica Delgado MEDA Case Manager, and Jeannette Urbina, Family Support Specialist with Good Samaritan

- El Centro Bayview is a collaboration of MNC, MEDA and Good Samaritan, they are here to talk about their FRC and supporting services between their three programs for all family clients. One of their families in their programs can utilize services at all their sites and have a primary case manager at MNC. MNC is the lead in the collaboration, they have a long history of providing services in the Mission where their primary clientele has been Latino population. There has been a lot of gentrification, she pointed out that SF is the most expensive city in the world. Traditionally it used to be the Mission that new folks moved to, now they can no longer afford it so many have moved to SOMA, the Tenderloin and Bayview. They have seen an increase in numbers of Latinos in the Bayview, commuting services back to the mission. With the support of the city, they have been tasked to provide services for their patients in the community they now live in. They want to be respectful and work collaboratively with the agencies already in the neighborhood and are offering to work together and help with communications. Some of the services they provide are Father's groups, parenting groups and classes, parent child interactive groups, case management, financial screenings and they have an immigration attorney for clients to consult with. They are welcoming families to plug-in and learn about the services they provide. All are here to speak about the services they are providing at El Centro. Jessie's is with MEDA, their goal is to support their families with resources and consultation for economic opportunities and stability. They are there to help the families access their programs and services where they live by providing the same offerings as the MEDA in the Mission. They help with finances, can help start savings accounts and encourage economic stability and growth. She can

also help with filing taxes and have some referrals for employment. Jeanette is a Family Advocate from Good Samaritan. They provide the parent and child interactive groups, 0-12 and 12-36 months with activities and early learning, a lot of it is helping children learn vocabulary and gain reading skills. One of their workshops guides families in making an emergency action plan to address situations based on their immigration status, if there is an interaction with Immigration. They also provide ESL Classes, Family and Community events and with their partnership, their clients can access all the services in one place. Carlos Bocanegra, attorney at MNC is now speaking. He is tasked to help provide immigration consultation for the families, consultation for housing and for citizenship. If there is any needs, make a referral to him at their office, also add that the goal is serve the entire community, open to learning and open to getting to know each other's cultures. Learn about more history and teach the families. Located 141 industrial, by the warehouses, El Centro 1341 Evans's, other side of APRI. If someone comes, there is reps for all the agencies at El Centro, but different days have standing services, they post their services and schedule. 2. Wu Yee Children's Services – Cindy Lin, Resource & Referrals & Kiyomi Noguchi, Special Events Coordinator - Wu Yee Children's Services started 40 years ago in Chinatown, they expanded from a small enrollment center to serving over 7 thousand families and have 12 development centers across the city. Wu Yee Serves nearly 60 pregnant women children and families, their program starts in August on 8/20/18, a family can apply at any center, and can pick up applications there. They discussed the demographics at Wu Yee, very diverse in general, here in the Bayview, they have two sites with these locations having very diverse demographics, Asian, Latin and African American. Here their site is in partnership with the PUC, do childcare for some employers and employees that have need with new jobs and it's a new partnership with PUC. Also at Portola, the Excelsior, Chinatown, the resource and referrals recently expanded to a lot more zip codes. Many families are going to their sites, so they moved to where the majority of their constituents are. Early learning scholarships, they are a FCCQN family childcare site (Family Child Care Quality Network), have a food program, and offer reimbursements to providers for sharing meals to their families. A lot of advocacy to increase reimbursement rates for childcare providers to thrive and succeed. Need to make sure childcare agencies can get fair reimbursement and thrive. In regards to their waitlist, they have a large amount of families on their waitlist. Wu Yee advocates for more services and better accessibility. For future housing, Wu Yee would encourage the developers to save a unit as a family child care home unit, when there is new development it's a great resource and opportunity for a family child care provider. Makes a great impact. Have federal funding, state funding and local funding, are a mixture of funding to serve the population. Big portion is from the state and local funding sources. COMMUNITY BUILDING

1. Eco Center – Anne Marie Dompe, Eco Center Programs Coordinator – Anne Marie introduced herself and begun with a little background on the Eco Center and other agencies and programs under Bay.org and the Eco-Tarium. Anyone have been there? Ecotarium is their science-based program, have the information on the sea life and marine mammals. Here in Bayview, their program is at the Heron's Head Park, it's the Eco Center. Heron's Head Park is a park that was landfill on the Port property, the building at the Eco Center is self-sustaining in power, water and waste. They host age appropriate education Saturday and most days at their center about the park and ecology of the park. Their programming includes Baysplash, Internships, and College/Adult tours. They have had conversations about serving the Bayview while in the Bayview and have included workforce programs for the youth and community. Organizations in the Bayview are invited to use the Eco Center for meetings and other space needs and the space is free, the ask just needs to be for a nonprofit organization. Bay splash maximum capacity is about 60. It's a great place, check it out. Many services and great views. Many of the community know about Heron's Head Park and their

Bayview Transportation Plan - Join the Steering Committee and Help Your Community Direct \$600,000 in Bayview Transportation Funding The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) has secured \$600,000 to improve transit and transit access for the Bayview's residents. These funds could be spent on infrastructure, such as new bus stops and improved routes to transit, or on programs, like a community shuttle or more frequent MUNI service. To decide on how to spend these new funds, the SFMTA is launching a participatory budgeting exercise. Through participatory budgeting, community members work together to come up with ideas, develop them into proposals and vote on where the money will go. The SFMTA is seeking interested members of the Bayview community to serve on our Steering Committee, which will decide on the rules of the participatory budgeting process, which projects are eligible for voting and funding, and how the overall process is run in the community. The SFMTA wants there to be no barriers to participation in the Steering Committee. The agency will be offering compensation for community members willing to dedicate their time to this effort. Women, people of color, seniors, youth, and people with low incomes are especially encouraged to apply.
