





The Kuumba Healing Project assists children, adolescents, families and communities of African descent in the Southeast section of San Francisco: Bernal Heights, Outer Mission, Excelsior, Little Hollywood, Bayview and Visitacion Valley through wholistic, trauma informed and culturally relevant family driven and youth guided clinical services. These services include; African centered and culturally relevant psychotherapy, advocacy and school collaborations and consultations, parent training and onsite services.

We work with community-based organizations, public service agencies, advisory groups, schools and other organizations with the explicit intention to strengthen youth and families of African descent, as well as all other disenfranchised youth and families in the Southeast region of San Francisco.


