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## PRESENTATIONS

**1. Bayview Hunters Point Foundation for Community Improvement - Wanda Whitaker, JBR Consultant - D10 Youth Leadership Shadowing Project** - Terry Ryan, BVHPCI and Wanda Whitaker, JBR Partners are here to share about the D10 Youth Leadership Shadowing Project. The D-10 Youth Shadowing Project is an opportunity for up to 20 young people residing, working or have an affiliation with District 10. Participating in the Youth Shadow Program allows youth, business owners, corporate executives and community policy makers to meet and learn from one another. Young people will be able to speak to and learn from leaders in their community about issues impacting their neighborhoods such as issues around land use and redevelopment while gaining a “hands-on” understanding about parliamentary procedures (Robert’s Rules of Law) and policy making on a monthly basis. Members of the HPSCAC (Hunters Point Shipyard Citizen’s Advisory Committee) are able to listen to the perspectives of young people and gain a well-rounded understanding of the experiences of youth in as they pursue policies that impact their future and the betterment of their community. Additionally, youth will be invited to participate in many activities with policymakers including committee/Board meetings. The Program will offer young people the opportunity to work together for the betterment of their community. Through this opportunity, youth participants will develop a deeper understanding of roles in the policy arena, interact with their peers in a unique space and have a dynamic experience to add to their resumes. Here are a few of the participating Business/Corporations, D10 CBO’s, Private NonProfits and Civic Government Agencies, Linked IN, Google, Facebook, Twitter, Warriors / Giants, Hunters Point Family, %100 College Prep, YCD, CYC, 3rd Street, College Track, YMCA, Horizons Unlimited, Potrero Hill Neighborhood House, SCDC, Bayview Hunters Point Foundation, Community Boards/Committees and other City Agencies. Their outreach and recruitment process is comprised of a focus group and community nominations. The focus group would be comprised of young people to define categories of youth interest and expertise. Regarding nominations, we request that community organizations, government agencies, corporations, small businesses and schools nominate young people for inclusion on the Young Adult Advisory Committee. This Program/Project offers young people a fellowship with CAC Members for the opportunity to work together for improving the Bayview Hunters Point community to benefit tomorrow’s residents. Through this opportunity, youth participants will develop a deeper understanding of roles in the policy arena, interact with their peers in a unique space and have a dynamic experience to add to their resumes. The launch time frame is from March to June, by March they are hoping to convene their planning committee with launching the program June. **2. 3rd St Youth Center & Clinic - Joi Jackson Morgan, Executive Director and Grace Morrison, Health Education Coordinator** - Joi Jackson-Morgan, ED is here today to introduce her new staff and the Youth Outreach Squad/Summer Health Education Program. She shared about the 3rd St history, from 2005 as Bayview Healing Arts. She shared that they just posted a new video promoting their work on their website. ([Link Here](#)). Now introduces Ashia Coleman, Youth Development Specialist. Sharing about the Youth Outreach Squad. YOS/SHEP aims to educate students ages 12-17 years old on health topics such as sexual reproduction, mental health and nutrition that results in community advocacy and outreach. YOS is

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available in spring and fall sessions, SHEP is available in summer only- 8 week program, both programs are stipend based, SHEP Session: Application open: April 15th, 2019, Application deadline: May 13th, 2019 at 5PM, Interviews will be conducted after all submissions, Session starts: June 17th, 2019. They go out to the community and provide community outreach. They have program in summer too, the Summer Health Education Program. Summer program ends in August. Shared more pictures (will be in the minutes) Joi and Aisha share the youth earn minimum wage, and introduces, Grace Morrison, their new Health Education Coordinator. They work together on their Leadership Academy programming. 3LA is available fall and spring. I lead the program Health Core, for our older youth, passed flyers and applications, now currently accepting for the summer, 18-24 yr old, One-year program that sets young adults ages 18-24 up for success in a health-focused career. It's health-based curriculum, professional development, field trips & health care facility tours, job shadowing, mentorship, & summer internship. Participants enroll in college classes, earn credits & relevant health care experience and move toward certification and/or college degrees. [Health Core](#) web page information, please contact her for more information. Joi shared they do a lot of work with 5 Keys, focus on the youth's goals and have matching resources. Using potential careers to provide more resources including case management. Shakeyla O'Cain, Housing Coordinator introduces herself and their Homepoint program. Engages homeless TAY and families 18-24 years old with additional services offered: Individual mental health, Medical care, Parenting and pregnancy support groups, Case management: education support, employment, etc. Subsidized housing on the pathway to permanent housing. When Youth Coordinated Entry launches, the flow will go as followed: Services will consist of Problem Solving & Assessments to prioritize housing needs. First a referral to HomePoint, then through the Youth Coordinated entry process with the final piece, offering housing support. Support youth to stay housed outside of the housing system, encourage other family members as support. Shakeyla will support them throughout the process and help set them up and provide resources to become eligible and able to stay housed in San Francisco. She share the access point sites, will provide the slides with minutes. Shakeyla is in the process of helping some youth and families. Also shared that they are also addressing food insecurity, working with different orgs to provide this. Trying to be a full one stop service provider for youth in our community. Shakeyla shared more of her history working with Ronnshia and coming up through the 3rd St. Youth Center programming. 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**2. Mission Hiring Hall & OEWD - Youth Workforce Development - Omar Del Real, Program Manager** is here today to share about Citibuild and their programming and workforce development for youth. CityBuild Academy aims to better prepare San Francisco residents entering the construction industry through our pre-apprentice training academy, to centralize citywide efforts aimed at developing employment opportunities for San Francisco residents in the construction trades. The program is administered by Office of Economic Workforce Development in partnership with City College SF, CCSF Evans Campus, Mission Hiring Hall, Charity Cultural Services Center and local unions and apprenticeship programs. Construction careers are exciting, fast-paced, production and rewarding work. Some adults now can tell their children that they helped build some of SF's landmarks. There are so many paths in construction, inspectors and surveyors, operating engineers, drywallers, carpenters, piledrivers, sheet metal workers, electricians, sound and community workers, floor coverers, tapes, painters and glazers, terrazzo workers, marble masons, and elevator technicians. There are so many projects being constructed right now and opportunities. Citybuild provides an educational pathway to these careers. We are providing our young adult workforce with opportunities for a career in construction, supporting them with apprenticeship, union dues support, stipends and a concentrated education program for testing and certification. Community Youth Center SF - Bayview Youth Advocate Summer Program - Stephany Welch, Program Coordinator and Donald Xiong, Program Specialist.** Stephany and Donald are here today to share about the Community Youth Center program, Bayview Youth Advocates. Support youth in community in Bayview. We are a part of CYC, but program is specific. Our mission is to engage multicultural highschool youth, 14-18 yrs old in D10, focus on leadership development component, through a multicultural lens. Important to look at how to support the youth from an emotional well being perspective. Empowering them to care about themselves and others. Value giving love and appreciation while building structure, have weekly programming at Thoroughgood, Ballboa, Burton Highschools. understanding that the youth may need a trauma informed approach. BYA youth development activities include providing safe space, mindfulness, areas of self improvement, recognize their natural and innate capabilities and skills, practicing a positive mindset, confidence in public speaking, a social and emotional beginning and end to the workshops. By being in the program, hoping they are envisioning a future outlook, mindful of opportunities out there. engage with peers outside of social media, being present, paying attention to the speaker, allowing youth to build their understanding. 3 main goals, Provide youth with necessary tools to navigate through community advocacy, understand and increase their knowledge of worldly issues, to what their awareness is, the choices that they have, and to also develop an in depth perspective of youth development and we want them to become youth leaders. Our program benefits, include community referrals through case management at the youth center, offer workshops, connections

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to social services, we also post exit services for employment and stipend at the end of the school year program. Engaging three different schools, have a summer program coming, June to August. Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays each week will be the days for the summer program.
