Youth Leaders focus on tobacco education, specifically how low-income communities of color are targeted by tobacco companies. Youth Leaders conduct research by collecting community opinions, identifying health effects, and creating policies on how to stop the tobacco industry from targeting low-income communities of color. Youth Leaders will survey their communities, complete a photo project, and conduct interviews. They will use the data they have collected to create a policy that they feel best protects the health of their community. **Reset Career**
