CONTACT/NOTES: The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Office of Health Equity (OHE) will be administering \$5M from the Centers for Disease and Control Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Grant (totaling \$499M) to ~16-30 community based organizations led by and serving communities facing inequities in COVID-19 impacts and infection. This funding is intended to advance the State's work to close racial, ethnic, and other disparities related to COVID-19 and associated chronic conditions. Community-Based Organizations will use the funding for pilot projects to reduce underlying inequities in the social determinants of health that have contributed to disproportionate harm from the Coronavirus among certain communities. NOTES: Requirement: Must bring proof of age and proof of residences such as a utility bill or driver's license. You do not need an appointment for the Southeast Health Center. This is a Walk-Up Site. Vaccine Brand: Moderna.

NOTES: Get a text or email when you are eligible to receive the vaccine. Vaccine supply is low, so you may have to wait to get a vaccine even when you are eligible. This notification is separate from the State's notification system.

The City is partnering with healthcare providers to establish high volume vaccine sites. Supply is limited, and you may not be able to book an appointment, even if you are eligible. Vaccines are free to people who live and work in San Francisco. You do not need insurance to book an appointment.

NOTES: BVOH in collaboration with the SF Department of Public Health and COLORS offers free COVID-19 testing every Monday and Thursday from 9:00am – 3:30pm. No pre-registration or appointment needed. Please wear a mask. Testing occurs in the BVOH plaza on 3rd Street (at Newcomb).

NOTES: Pop-up test sites are deployed to various neighborhoods most impacted by COVID-19, in partnership with community organizations. Sites and locations can change every 2 weeks, according to need. Only pop-up test sites with expected capacity are listed. During the current COVID-19 surge, there are longer than normal wait times. Drop-ins may be limited toward the end of the day, to make sure all testing is done properly. Sites may also close if it's raining. Test specimens need to be kept dry. These sites offer COVID-19 testing to minors under the age of 13 with guardian or parental consent. At the test sites, clinicians can also teach parents how to take a sample for their children.

The right hand line is for the general public. Results can take up to 3 days.

NOTES: San Francisco is deploying a new tool via text messaging to support you in case you test positive for COVID. It helps with case investigation and contact tracing while linking you to an online questionnaire about your health, needs for City support, and close contacts who might have been exposed to COVID-19. It is confidential, just like a phone call from the health department. Anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 in San Francisco (and provides a phone number at the time of their test) will receive a text message linking them to an online questionnaire about their health, their needs for City support, and their close contacts who might have been exposed to COVID-19. Close contacts will also receive a text message linking them to this online questionnaire, without identifying who might have exposed them to the virus. In addition, San Francisco residents who test positive and live in highly impacted neighborhoods of the City will receive a phone call from the health department. Anyone whose answers to the online questionnaire indicate that they need help isolating safely will receive a phone call from the health department, offering that help. We need all San Franciscans who receive the text message to respond and to let us know if they need our help in order to slow the spread of COVID-19. In a surge with a high volume of new cases, this tool will help us more quickly target our resources to those who need them most. WHAT: Avoid COVID-19 Scams

CONTACT/NOTES: Nobody legitimate from the City, State, or Federal government will call about the COVID19 vaccine and ask for your Social Security number, bank account, or credit card number. That's a scam. You cannot pay for early access to the #COVID19 vaccine. If you receive a call, text, email, or other message offering to sell early access, that's a scam. Do not respond. You cannot pay to put your name on a list for the #COVID19 vaccine. If you receive a call, text, email, or other message offering to sell a spot on a list for the vaccine, that's a scam. Do not respond. If you receive a call, text, or email offering the #COVID19 vaccine and requesting your personal or financial information, that's a scam. Do not respond. Avoid #COVID19 scams by learning how to tell the difference between a real contact tracer and a scammer. Legitimate tracers need health information, not money or personal financial information. Ignore offers of vaccinations and miracle treatments or cures for sale. Scammers are selling products to treat or prevent #COVID19 without proof that they work. ftc.gov/coronavirus/scams Nobody legitimate from the City, State, or Federal government will call or text and ask you to pay for the #COVID19 vaccine.
