teams to create an interim design that would be in place for 10 years. Since 2013 NHP has been used for events, which had an engagement station that asked attendees what they wanted to see on the site for the short & long term. STudio O wants to make sure the community articulates needs & desires. All of the information is available in a project report on www.nowhunterspoint.org. PG&E has stated they will come up with a plan for restarting programming & are looking for a local group to run it, but Studio O hasn't seen anything in the past year. PG&E agreed to host the BMAGIC giveaway but usually when community groups request site use, they receive no response or are declined. If the community wants to get the site back, they need to advocate.

Services, Offerings & Updates: Because the use of space has always been intentional, they aim to keep the transition intentional. Grant from the Rainin Foundation to create a site-specific dance performance to close out this phase. Taking place on Saturday, September 24th at 1pm on the Hunters Point Shoreline and will bring in local Bayview artists including Feline Finesse and Malik Seneferu. Part of the grant funds will be used to create a mini-book/pamphlet that includes community input from the past 8 years and their understanding of what PG&E's commitment to the land is - when they agreed to shut down the plant, the City has 1st right of refusal when land is sold. Studio O believes the site should be stewarded by the community and have community access. Lyslynn thanks Liz for continuing to uplift PG&E's promise to the community. Supervisor Walton has been a great advocate for the site. Je Ton - Has elder storytellers who can possibly participate. Liz will reach out to them.

Habitat for Humanity - CalHOME Repair Program:

History: Home preservation program focuses on sustaining home ownership, keeps families who have lived in communities for a long time in their homes and preserve their home as an asset for generations to come. Previously known as Neighborhood Vitalization. Performed 100+ repairs in Bayview Hunters Point.

Services, Updates & Offerings: Repairs focus on critical repairs to maintain safety and last next 30 years. Also repair code enforcement issues and work with the city to remediate the issue. Program funding used to be through private donors and corporate partnerships but the funding had limits to repairs. They are now partnering with the state of California for the CalHome Loan, this enables them to cover larger and more transformative repairs. Which census tract: 94124 or AMI index? Both AMI index and in specific census zones. Is the AMI based on federal or San Francisco? SF has inflated AMI so they are going based on local and not national (2022 AMI Levels, pg 11). They are general contractors that are licensed & insured, self-perform most work but find subcontractors when needed. If you know any contractors, send them to Annie. In the next 2 years, there are 60 first come, first served opportunities for repairs. Mauricha -Can someone help with applications? Yes, we are able to help either at their office or meet applicants where they are. If you have translation services available, that would be helpful. Mauricha - There is a list of numbers on the application but have no response, who can people contact? Contact Annie or homerepairs@gsf.org. Je Ton - Are there grants or loan forgiveness your organization might connect residents to that might be loan adverse? After the 30 years is up, if the family does not have financial means to pay they can extend the loan for another 30 years. The intention of the program is to invest in the repairs so the home value increases and can pay back the loan. Lydia - How can I find a client's census tract number to see if she qualifies? Check on the Google Map. Are the income limits gross or net? Gross. Where can you read about the 10 year clause? On the website under Program Requirements. Any rules about inheritance? There can be a co-applicant and work it out if someone inherited the home. The intention of the 10 year clause is to weed out newcomers looking to upgrade and beautify homes.
