NOTES: NexGeneGirls will grant six internships (valued at \$2500 each) to qualifying San Francisco high school girls (incoming freshmen, sophomores or juniors) to attend NexGeneGirls' eight-week summer Science Academy program. The internship position requires a mandatory Science Bootcamp at City College of San Francisco on the following dates: April 22, 29 and May 6 followed by an 8-week summer internship at an academic institution for 20 hours per week beginning in June. Students will develop Bioscience and leadership skills assisting with administering hands-on science lessons to middle school girls and working on individual science projects. At the NexGeneGirls Science Academy, students will have the opportunity to explore Bioscience careers meeting with leading female STEM professionals and experts, and visiting prominent academic and industry research organizations. Criteria for Selection/Factors for a successful applicant include: San Francisco high school girls (incoming 9th, 10th or

11th graders), Underrepresented groups, Interest in the Biosciences, Potential for leadership, Community service, Extracurricular activities & Academic achievement.

Young people in San Francisco can apply for up to \$10,000, three times a year, to fund their unique ideas and vision addressing important community issues and needs: School Year – Grants up to \$10,000; Spring – Grants up to \$5,000; Summer – Grants up to \$2,500.

NOTES: Spotlight on the Arts is California Lawyers for the Arts' summer internship and enrichment program for high school youth interested in the arts. Youth are paid a flat stipend of \$1200 for a seven week/20 hour per week commitment from June 9th through July 28th. Youth must be 14-17 with priority for low-income youth. Partnering organizations are arts education providers and presenters in theatre, fine and applied arts, writing, media, photography, music and dance including 826 Valencia, A.C.T. Costume Rental Shop, BAYCAT, BAVC, Blue Bear School of Music, Boys and Girls Club's Art Departments, Chinese Culture Center, de Young Museum, Recology Artists in Residence Program, Root Division, Southern Exposure, Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, and Z Space. Depending on the site, youth may assist instructors and develop their own projects, work in retail and serve as tour guides, as well as

work in office settings. Diverse office assignments include marketing on social media, developing website content, graphic design, videography, photography, and administrative tasks. We encourage sites to assign a variety of tasks and projects so that youth are engaged and always learning new things. Weekly workshops complement internships with interactive exercises in conflict resolution, communication, goal setting, presentations from professional speakers about arts careers, tours of arts facilities, as well as individual college and career advising.

NOTES: This program will take place at the San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park, meeting at the Hyde Street Pier. If you are unfamiliar with the location, we are on the water across from Ghirardelli Square. This is a completely FREE program. All your organization has to do is transport your group to and from the park. We will be providing all equipment and instruction. The kayaking sessions are from 9am to 12pm. These morning sessions will help us avoid the chilly, windy conditions that often arise in the afternoon. Each organization can come to ONE session. Kayaking days are Monday through Friday, July 10-August 4. Some of these dates are already taken by our returning groups, which is reflected on our attached Doodle poll. The sooner you can indicate your interest and preferred dates to us, the more likely you are to get locked into those dates. For a kayaking session your group can bring a maximum of 15 kids. Two adult chaperones are required for each group. Youth participants must be at least 12 years old and no older than 24 years old. *All chaperones must attend training on Saturday July 8th.* This training session will last approximately as long as a normal session with the start time TBD.
