This award provides up to \$10,000 to small institutions to digitize and preserve their humanities-related collections. Preservation Assistance Grants help small and mid-sized institutions — such as libraries, museums, historical societies, archival repositories, cultural organizations, town and county records offices, and colleges and universities — improve their ability to preserve and care for their significant humanities collections. These may include special collections of books and journals, archives and manuscripts, prints and photographs, moving images, sound recordings, architectural and cartographic records, decorative and fine art objects, textiles, archaeological and ethnographic artifacts, furniture, historical objects, and digital materials.

NOTES: The San Francisco Public Library (SFPL) will provide the chosen artist with a \$55,000 stipend over the course of the 18-month term to support their work and community engagement. The program was first announced in June as part of Mayor Breed's then proposed two-year budget. Since passing, a working group of City departments and community partners have been developing eligibility criteria and requirements for the new position. The Drag Laureate will embody San Francisco's historic, diverse and inclusive drag culture, elevating the entire community on the national and international stage. Those who want to apply to be the City's first Drag Laureate should apply by January 16, 2023. After applications close, a vetting committee made of representatives from City Departments and community groups will review the applications and bring finalists to Mayor Breed who will make the final selection.
