**NOTES:** You can buy a market-rate home in San Francisco with help from the Downpayment Assistance Loan Program (DALP)! Through the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD), DALP provides up to \$500,000 to first-time homebuyers. The 2023 DALP cycle will distribute \$17.9 million to assist at



least 35 households. DALP provides up to \$500,000 in down payment assistance to low- to middle-income first-time homebuyers earning up to 200% of the [Area Median Income \(AMI\)](#) for the purchase of a market-rate primary residence in San Francisco. No monthly payments are required! The funds are available to **General** public households, **Educators** employed by the San Francisco Unified School District, and **First responders** (active, uniformed members of the Fire, Police, or Sheriff's Departments).
